The King Store and Homestead Museum are listed on the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places. The King Store was built around 1827. The King Homestead Museum was completed in c. 1878. The house is a Queen Anne structure that boasts a 1936 mural by James W. Marland. The building is proposed to be used as a museum and community offices.

In 2003, the Roxbury Historic Trust received \$31,000 from the Trust Fund for roof repair and turret stabilization at the Museum. The 2004 grant funded the replacement of exterior porch balusters and a porch post, plaster repairs, and wallpaper reproduction and installation at the Museum.

The 2005 and 2006 grants assisted with the preparation of components of a Historic Structures Report for the King Homestead Museum and King Store. A 2007 grant provided for the stabilization of a rubble stone perimeter wall behind the King Store.

The 2008 and 2009 Construction grants completed the replacement of the slate roof, metal gutters at the King Store, and replacement of downspouts at the King House. The 2013 grant for the Store is to restore 14 windows, 3 exterior doors, and north elevation icebox.

The 2014 grant will assist with work pertaining to the King House's envelope, structural framing and electrical system. The 2015 grant will provide for the completion of foundation repairs and repointing, siding restoration, floor framing reinforcement at the King House.

The 2017 grant will provide for exterior rehabilitation of windows and doors. The 2018 grant will assist with the stabilization and rebuilding of a stone wall.
